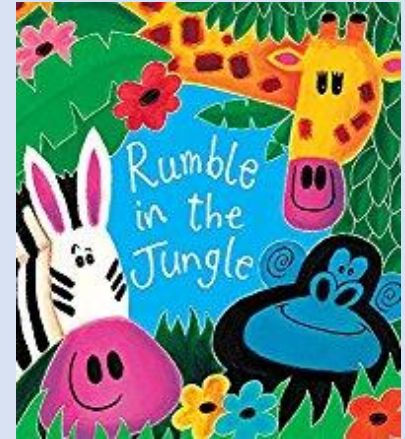


Spare clothes

Within this Imaginative Learning Project (ILP) some key areas we will cover are:

Arrangements for the start of the day and end of the day

School starts at 8:30am. Staff will be available on the playground at 8:25am when the door opens for children to enter. Any pupils arriving after 8:30 must report immediately to the school office as the FS1 gate will be locked. **Please note that pupils arriving after 8:35am will receive a late mark. Attendance in school is really important to support your child's routine and progress. If they are too ill to attend please ensure you ring the school before 9am on the first day of their absence. A Doctors note may be required if they are regularly ill. Otherwise please send them into school and we will always ring you to collect them if they are unwell.**

School finishes for part time children at 11:30am and at 2:40pm for full time FS1 children (please note that this is different for the rest of the school who finish at 2.45pm). Pupils will need to be collected from the classroom door. Older brothers and sisters can then be collected afterwards.

Golden Time

Each class will continue to have 'Weekly Golden Time.' Each day your child keeps their name on the Rule Board they earn 5 minutes 'Golden time' per day. Over the week they can therefore earn a maximum 25 minutes per week. Golden Time will take place each Friday at 1:30pm. The number of minutes they have earned each week will be recorded in journals each Friday, e.g. 20/25mins.

Getting in touch

Please use your child's journal as much as possible. These should be signed by yourselves and sent into school **every day**. Please support your child in placing their journal in the correct box every morning. Do come to see us and make an appointment if you or your child has anything you would like to discuss in person however small!

Reading book and home learning

Your child is now receiving a school reading book. These **books need to be in school every day to enable staff to read the book in school with your child.** They will be changed weekly, **when we can see they have read at home.** Please can you read with your child at home daily and write it in their journal. Other books can be read with your children and recorded in their journal. These will be used to calculate the attitudes to learning report sent home half termly. Your child will get an extra 5 minutes Golden Time, each week they read 4 or more times so please remember to write/sign their journal. **Home learning will continue to be given out on a Thursday and taken in to be looked at the following Tuesday.** Please make sure the books are in on these days.
